

Course Content

In Junior High Fashion Studies, students will be provided the opportunity to work with a variety of textile materials. This course is offered four times throughout the year, therefore, each offering will cover different types of crafts. For the first term, students will be working extensively with crochet. This course aims to introduce this art to students, creating small projects that will be taken home, as well as donated around the community. Through this course, not only will students learn a new art, crochet also offers improved dexterity and hand eye coordination. It's good for you!



Resources

All resources, such as hooks and yarn, will be provided.

Objectives

Simplicity is stressed in this course, most students have not worked with crochet before. In this course, students will:

- Learn how to hold the hook so yarn can flow smoothly in order to make stitches of uniform size and tension
- Learn how to hold yarn and/or thread correctly
- Learn how to make a slip knot
- Learn how to do a chain stitch
- Learn the basic stitches - single crochet, double crochet, and triple crochet
- Learn the slip stitch
- Learn how to read crochet abbreviations and follow directions
- Learn how to turn work
- Learn how to sew seams
- Make a variety of shapes

Evaluation

Course grading will be based on students projects themselves, as well as reflections and journal logs. Projects will be graded on two main areas, general appearance and workmanship.
